Have you done your taxes yet? They're due April 18!

Once again, Lacey's local AARP tax help volunteers will be available to provide assistance in preparing your taxes. Their hours are 11 to 3:30pm on Saturdays in 2016, a change from year's past. Help is provided on a first-come, first-served basis but this year the tax preparers

are doing a same-day signup sheet so you don't have to wait in the library once you get your name down. It's a very popular service, so if you need help be sure to arrive at the library before 10am on Saturday to get your name on the list. The library currently has preprinted forms & instructions for 1040, 1040A, & 1040EZ available; all other forms & instructions will need to be printed from www.irs.gov or can be requested directly from the IRS. Library staff can help you print from our own computers as part of your 50 pages of free printing each week, or can provide printouts of popular forms at the Information desk (we usually can provide around 10 free printouts per person).
